

FAMILY

Parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, and other such relatives are not permitted as overnight guests. A list of nearby accommodations is published on the College's website.

Students and staff members of the College are encouraged to ask unfamiliar people in residence halls for identification and a purpose for being in the halls.

8

Students and staff members of the College are encouraged to ask individuals who do not qualify as guests to leave the residence hall.

9

Individuals who refuse to comply with such a request (#8 above) may be subject to arrest.

10

Any resident hosting an overnight guest in the residence halls, apartments, or houses must have obtained a guest pass from the guest on file with the resident assistant at least 10 hours before the visit. This includes the overnight visit of other Wisconsin Lutheran College students. If this is not possible because of an emergency visit, you should talk to the residence life staff as soon as possible.

ALCOHOL

If you are a Wisconsin Lutheran College resident and have guests who arrive under the influence of alcohol, you must contact a Wisconsin Lutheran College residence life staff member immediately. Failure to notify staff leaves you responsible for any consequences that result.

GUEST POLICY

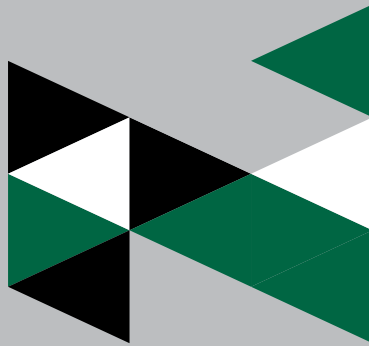
RES HALL POLICY

Only students officially assigned to a residence hall space may reside there. Each student assigned to college-operated housing is responsible for any violation of college or residence hall policy, or for violation of local, state, or federal laws that occur within his or her space. Additionally, WLC students can only sleep in the room or apartment to which they are assigned, unless they receive permission via a guest pass in advance to sleep in a different room or apartment.

RESIDENCE HALL

The college residence halls are open to residents of the hall, college officials, and guests (as outlined below) who have a specific, legitimate reason for being in the building. Keys and access cards must not be shared with anyone at any time.

There is a minimum \$100 fine for sharing keys or access cards with anyone, at any time, because this jeopardizes security for everyone.



The College's Board of Regents designated the college campus, the facilities, and the grounds as special-purpose areas generally not open to the public. The Director of Residence Life has adopted the following policy for the use of residence halls by guests:

1

A guest is one who comes to a residence hall to visit a specific resident or who has received an invitation to visit the residence hall by the College, the residence hall director, or a member of the student body for a specific occasion, function, tour, official visit, or program taking place in the residence hall. Any student from outside the designated residence hall is a guest under the terms of this policy.

All guest visits are limited to the time and location of the invitation. If guests are visiting a specific resident, the guest must be accompanied by the resident at all times while in the residence hall. The resident is responsible for the conduct of his or her guest(s). Also, the resident is responsible for familiarizing the guest with pertinent college rules and regulations.

In the event of damage by guests, the resident will be responsible for covering the cost of any repairs or replacements.

The College does not allow members of the opposite sex to stay overnight. Floor hours for members of the opposite sex are posted in each hall and can be found in the Student Handbook. Residents are responsible for making sure that their guests use the proper restroom facilities.

Residents may have overnight guests of the same sex for a period of time not to exceed two consecutive nights, three nights per month, or six days per semester. This includes other college residents as well as commuters.

The conduct of the guests must be lawful and in accordance with college and residence hall rules and regulations.

It is the responsibility of the resident to ensure that the presence or behavior of his or her guests does not infringe on the resident's roommates.
